

Cape Coral Tech Cosmetology Uniform Dress Code 2013-2014

The uniform dress code for beginning students is ...

Uniform T-shirts (Purchased from Instructor)

Black, tan or brown khaki pants or Capri's (below knee)

Black, tan or brown shoes

Apron (Included in the required kit.)

ID badges (school provided) must be worn where they are visible on the right side of the shirt or apron at all times.

Hair, make-up and jewelry will be worn appropriately for a professional environment. (You should be a good example of your work!)

A minimum of 3 (three) T-shirts printed with the Cape Coral Tech Spa logo must be purchased from the instructor at the current prices. (Two polo shirts for the advanced students must be purchased after 450 hours of enrollment.) Aprons must be worn when performing all services. Long sleeve shirts if needed may only be worn under T's. Pants or Capri's and shoes are purchased on your own. Save receipts in case they are not acceptable.

Good personal hygiene is required.

No Perfume or heavily scented products.

Visible piercings to exposed body parts other than the ears or unsafe areas are prohibited.

Wearing of hats, caps, hoodies, or sunglasses is not allowed.

No torn or ripped clothing.

No shorts are allowed. (The knees must be covered.)

No sweat pants or skin tight clothing.

Flip flops are not acceptable. (If it goes between the toes, it's a no!)

Slipper type shoes or heels are not acceptable. (They do not provide proper support and may damage the flooring.)

No messages or graphics other than designer logo allowed on clothing.

No camouflage clothing.

Dangling or unsafe jewelry will not be allowed and must be removed for all services.

The Cosmetology program requires a cleaner more professional look.

Students must adhere to the District Code in the District Code of Conduct, the Cape Coral Tech Dress Code in the Student Handbook, and the Dress Code of this program.

***The Instructor has the final decision if something is not appropriate. All dress code rules shall be enforced by any member of the faculty, staff or administration. Students in violation will face administrative action ranging from disciplinary action to being sent home.**
